


## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND DISASTER RECOVERY PLANNING

## Do you provide affordable or supportive housing for rural areas?



To be eligible for technical assistance, training, support, and advice on developing capacity you must be meet eligibility criteria and serve low- and moderate-income people in rural\* areas.

Assistance may be provided through a combination of virtual and in person consultation.

\*Qualifying rural areas are typical areas with less 50,000 people

## Are you ready to respond after a disaster? Do you have a disaster recovery plan?

If you need help and have or are planning to develop rural housing, we might be to assist.

Our work together could increase your capacity to plan for and respond to natural disasters.

**Activities might include:** 

- Access to trainings to learn about supportive housing and services
- > Obtain tools to assess disaster readiness
- Development of an organizational assessment including actions to improve disaster readiness and increase community partnerships
- Assistance to create an affordable housing portfolio to use when restoring damaged housing units
- Creation of a disaster recovery plan to preserve housing units and access funding for projects
- Learn skills needed to respond to disasters and create and preserve housing projects

WHO IS ELIGIBLE: Entities serving low- and moderate-income people in rural areas who are:

- Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDOs)
- Community Development Corporations (CDCs)
- Local Governments
- Tribal Communities
- Rural Community-Based Housing Development Organizations (RHDO) which organizations currently or planning to engage in housing development as part of their mission
